Stop here for a quick meal! Kiosks offering mouth-watering local delights are located right behind the bus stop. You can rent bicycles to ride around the island.



Shielding himself as best he could from the downpour, Martin dashed across the street towards a row of conservation shophouses in Singapore's historical neighbourhood. By the time he reached shelter, his shoes and bag were drenched. Yet, he refused to let the dampness hinder him during his day of self-exploration.

Martin had been living in London since his early twenties. The busyness of life took 5 over and the last time he set foot in Singapore was eight years ago, when his sister, Marion, had given birth to Anne. He was back this time, indefinitely, for he had been fired from his company in London. Immediately, Martin was chauffeured around by Marion who sensed his woe and persisted in forcing him to visit relatives and see the latest sights. Martin was grateful for the distraction as being surrounded by family and a new environment eased the gloom that he was feeling. However, he longed to walk the city streets alone and reconnect with Singapore face-to face, instead of looking through the windows of his sister's car.

An opportunity came knocking when Mariori suddenly had urgent errands to run so Martin jumped at the chance to spend the day out by himself. He deliberately made his way to the older parts of town to see if he could still recognise the streets that he used to roam as a child with his father. He was rather taken aback as many shophouses had been refurbished into boutique offices or restaurants. Some of the transformations made rendered the shophouses unrecognisable. There was little left of the old-world charm that he remembered. 20

Continuing his exploration when the rain finally stopped, Martin came upon a traditional *kopitiam*, dialect for coffeehouse, seemingly forgotten by time. Dim bulbs hung from the ceiling while dusty fans swivelled from side to side, doing their best to shift the humid air. The walls and furniture were chipped and the floors were grimy. In spite of the squalor, Martin felt drawn to this old-style coffeehouse. It was unpretentious and casual, 25 welcoming all who wanted to have a meal or simply take a break, much unlike the unnecessary rigidity and coldness of some modern food courts that served generic fare prepared by disinterested cooks.

Martin sat at one of the tables, relishing the aroma emanating from the simmering soup pot in the only functioning food stall there. This hinted at the expertise with which the soup was prepared, sure **evidence** that he was in the presence of a master chef who had honed his skills through years of preparing his one dish.

To pay homage to **such craft**, Martin ordered a large Hokkien prawn noodles soup. The old man got up and shuffled in his slippers towards his stall. With **mindless familiarity**, the hawker blanched yellow noodles and green *kangkong* before laying them at the bottom 35 of a bowl. Over them, he placed a generous layer of prawns and meat chunks. At last, he ladled in the promising broth and served the steaming bowl to his sole customer.

Martin tucked into the much anticipated meal before him. The prawns and meat were succulent. the vegetables had a satisfying crunch, and the noodles were consistently chewy. Not oily, the broth was packed with a dense flavour that he delighted in above everything else. The old man's creation was more than just food – it was soul food.

With each mouthful, a sense of warmth permeated through Martin's body, awakening forgotten memories of his father lifting him onto stools at roadside hawker stalls. He was starting to remember his roots. Finishing the noodle soup to the last drop, Martin sat back with wave after wave of fond recollections of Singapore. He was truly home.
