Section F: Synthesis & Transformation (2 marks)

Whales are meant to be free but Keiko's freedom was taken away.

In 1978, almost two-year-old Keiko was peacefully swimming when he was accidentally caught in a fishing net off the coast of Iceland. He was shipped to an aquarium in Canada to be one of six whales for human entertainment.

Later, the owner of an amusement park in Mexico bought Keiko. There, he lived in a narrow pool. He experienced poor health and was bullied by other whales for he was the youngest and most timid. Despite this, he became the park's star, performing five times a day.

Subsequently, Keiko was cast in the movie "Free Willy," which told the story of a boy trying to free a captive whale. The movie became popular and many people were interested in Keiko. They wanted to help free him.

Thanks to donations, Keiko moved to the United States, where he lived in a pool that was four times bigger than his old one. His health got better there, and he learned skills that could help him survive in the wild. After 19 years, Keiko was returned to the waters of Iceland. Still, he struggled to adapt and chose to stay near boats. He wanted to be near people rather than join the other whales.

Sadly, Keiko passed away at the age of 26, never really experiencing the freedom he deserved.
