



An oil spill has led to beaches around Singapore being closed. A moving Netherlands dredger had struck a stationary Singapore vessel. This ruptured one (16) oil cargo tank, releasing about 400 tonnes of fuel into the sea. Oil stained the sand of the beaches black, sending the stench of petrochemicals in the air. Clean-up efforts are underway, as oil slicks have also spread to Johor. The crews are working round the clock to limit the impact on wildlife after two oil-soaked kingfishers died.

Organisms such as sea turtles can ingest oil which blocks airways, fills stomachs and damages tissues and organs. About 100 workers are deployed daily to clean up beaches affected by the oil spill. The public is advised against fishing and foraging for marine wildlife. The scale of the impact is still unknown.


